

School Attendance (Boundaries) Areas:

The Board shall establish school attendance areas and periodically review boundary adjustments. The director of schools shall enforce these areas established by the Board.

The primary considerations governing the establishment of a school attendance area are:

1. The educational opportunity afforded students;
2. The capacity of each school; and
3. The geographic location of each school in relationship to the surrounding student population.

As of July 1, 1995 the School Attendance Areas (School Boundaries) listed below are in effect:

The boundary line for the North Clinton Elementary School is the corner of North Main and Weaver Avenue east to Charles G. Seivers Boulevard. The boundary line follows the boulevard north to the Clinch River. The boundary line also follows North Main Street on Hwy 25W to the city limits.

The children on the south side of Charles G. Seivers Boulevard to the Clinch River and from the railroad tracks at Eagle Bend will be allowed to attend either Clinton Elementary School or North Clinton Elementary School.

The boundary line for Clinton Elementary School is from the city limits on Hwy 25W or North Main Street to the corner of Weaver Avenue. It then follows Weaver Avenue over to Charles G. Seivers Boulevard, and then to the river at the railroad station. Following the river the boundary line then goes to the city limits on Oak Ridge Hwy. The boundary then continues to follow the city limits back around to the city limit on North Main.

The boundary line for South Clinton Elementary School is all of the city located on the south of Lewallen Bridge and the Clinch River.
